Counseling and Therapy in **Video Series**

Perhaps the greatest source of anxiety for students in the mental health field is the prospect of working with clients in face-to-face counseling encounters. The four-volume Counseling and Therapy in Video Series provides an invaluable firsthand look at the realities of working with clients and the challenges associated with putting theoretical concepts into practice. This series contains more than 2,500 hours of footage from actual therapy sessions, training videos, and reenactments conducted by renowned counseling professionals.

The four volumes work in tandem to support counseling programs at all levels, with earlier volumes laying a strong foundation for counselor education with therapists like Carl Rogers, Allen Ivey, and Monica McGoldrick, and later volumes placing particular focus on emerging topics such as brain-based therapy, mindfulness,

and multicultural issues. Content explores dozens of therapeutic methods, diagnoses, and client types.

Volume I

Volume I features prominent therapists such as Jon Carlson, Sue Johnson, Allen Ivey, Insoo Kim Berg, Derald Wing Sue, and others as they demonstrate their methods. The material is clustered around easy-to-search and easy-to-browse topical subject areas and therapeutic methods, which include addiction, brief therapy, career counseling, child therapy, cognitive-behavioral therapy, domestic violence, family therapy, group therapy, narrative therapy, supervision, and working with LGBT clients.

Volume II

Volume II updates and expands upon the first collection, with 300 hours of video, placing special emphasis on contemporary topics such as neuroscience, coaching, family therapy, child therapy, geriatric therapy, play therapy, weight control and eating disorders, post-traumatic stress disorder, sex therapy, and culturally sensitive therapy.

World-renowned therapists such as Albert Ellis, Allen Ivey, John Norcross, Arnold Lazarus, Otto Kernberg, and Violet Oaklander demonstrate their methods in true-to-life situations. With more than 70 percent of the films created since 2005, the collection stays apace with the evolving practices and theories of the counseling field.

Volume III

Volume III presents a firm grounding in the theoretical modalities of counseling and psychotherapy while expanding into new and emerging areas such as social media, veterans, cyberbullying, mindfulness, and neuroscience. This volume adds more than 300 hours to the series, with 70 percent of titles filmed in 2012 or later.

This collection features the "giants" of counseling and psychotherapy such as Viktor Frankl, Albert Bandura, Albert Ellis, Aaron Beck, Virginia Satir, Jay Haley, Carl Rogers, Pat Love, Samuel Gladding, Jon Kabat-Zinn, Jon Carlson, Natalie Rogers, and John Arden. Together, these films form a collection that emphasizes the evolution of the field, juxtaposing this





















history of counseling and psychotherapy with future directions by examining new techniques, methods, and researchinformed practice.

Volume IV

In the past few years, counselors have seen a steady rise in cases involving specific underserved populations such as transgender individuals, victims of racial trauma, and veterans suffering from PTSD. At the same time, the counseling profession has developed new guidelines with regard to cultural and gender sensitivity as well as the deeper connections between neuroscience and counseling. Additionally, there is the growing threat of compassion fatigue by experienced counselors themselves. Volume IV rounds out the series by providing all-new video and text resources tied to these prevalent issues.

Students and scholars can access demonstrations, interviews with experts, transcripts from actual counseling sessions, and other rich resources that will supplement any counseling, social work, or psychology course, and better prepare students to become the practitioners of tomorrow. Students benefit from observing theory in practice, interacting with content that tightly aligns with CACREP eight common core areas, and becoming familiar with DSM-5® and ICD-10. Instructors benefit from lecture replacement videos

that supplement in-class lectures and homework assignments while addressing challenging topics such as psychopharmacology, neuroscience, LGBTQ, and research methods.
