Illustrated Civil War Newspapers and Magazines: Important and Rare Periodicals from Confederate, Union, Abolitionist, and British Presses

Illustrated Civil War Newspapers and Magazines is the definitive online Civil War media resource. The database contains 65,000 pages drawn from forty-nine periodicals and campaign newspapers—3,720 issues published from 1860 to 1865. Many of the publications are now rare and hard to find, with an item sometimes extant only in a single archive. Carefully sought out and compiled from seventeen museum, library, and private collections, including those of the American Antiquarian Society and the Chicago Historical Society, these resources are now available to modern scholars in electronic form for the first time through this project.

Four viewpoints are represented—Union, Confederate, Abolitionist, and British. Every page has been carefully re-keyed to 99.995% accuracy, making the issues fully searchable, and also scanned at a high resolution, providing exceptional page images. Search by year, group of years, or topic, or browse each publication from issue to issue through the years, experiencing the Civil War as did readers of the time—through the articles, illustrations, cartoons, and maps that brought the war home as events unfolded.

Contextual commentaries: *Illustrated Civil War Newspapers and Magazines* contains dozens of scholarly contributions, including an introduction by the Pulitzer Prize-winning scholar James McPherson. There are introductions detailing the background and importance of each of the publications, and essays such as *The Presidential Elections of 1860 and 1864*; *Civil War Literature*; *The End of Slavery: The Creation of the 13th Amendment*; and others.

Indexing: The articles are tagged with more than a dozen document types that, combined with additional indexing, make it possible to find all advertisements that contain the word *Amboline* or all panoramas in Virginia, for example. Document types include *advertisement*, *article series*, *biographical sketch/obituary*, *cartoon*, *editorial*, *fiction*, *government announcement*, *humor/satirical commentary*, *illustration*, *map*, *news story/item*, *panoramic view*, *poetry*, *portrait*, *publisher's notice*, and *travel narrative*.

Image quality: There are many thousands of illustrations in the database. Every page has been scanned at 300 dpi so that even small images are easy to view and large versions are displayed in exceptional detail.
